Actually, the Transport Tycoon save format has a few variants. There's the original and deluxe versions, which allow 41 and 49 bytes respectively for the title, including a two-byte checksum. Then there is the modern OpenTTD format, which is tag-based like a PNG, and, catastrophically for our purposes, contains a fixed value at offset zero. So, original version it is.
